SPONSORS HELP FUEL THREE FLIGHTS IN 2010

Freedom Honor Flight has become one of the most successful Honor Flight hubs in the nation. Since it began in 2008, the hub has taken more than 500 veterans to Washington DC on the “flight of a lifetime.”

Organizers set an initial goal of two flights per year. Fundraising efforts proved to be successful. Individuals responded, communities held fundraisers, legion posts donated proceeds from events, and several businesses got involved and made donations. Meanwhile, the list of applications grew and organizers feared the two flights per year pace might not accommodate all the WWII veteran applicants—the youngest of whom are in their mid eighties.
